#### NEW COLLEGE STUDENT RECEPTIONS



## From The Pastor LOVE BEYOND TELLING ... THE EUCHARISTIC JESUS (Part 4)

It was just before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. (Jn. 13:1)



The Mystery of the Eucharist is the greatest gift Jesus Christ has given to His Church. It is that perfect farewell present that allows Him to truly remain with us until the end of the world. It is the most perfect expression of God's love and mercy we could imagine. All time is somehow contained in the Eucharist. The past, present, and future come together in Jesus, the Alpha and the Omega. The loving sacrifice of our Savior on Calvary's Cross more than 2000 years ago is made present to us; we are united with Christ and one another to truly become His living Body here and now; and we receive a pledge of future life and glory with Him in heaven. In the Eucharist Jesus continues to say: "I came that you might have life, and have it to the full." (Jn 10:10). And "I am the Bread of Life. I myself am the living bread come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread shall live forever." (Jn 6:48, 51)

As the Church teaches, the Eucharist is Jesus Christ Himself, truly present, it is the source and the summit of the life of the Church, which is His Body. St. Pope John Paul II, who recognized the Eucharist as the great hope for the world, wrote beautifully on the Eucharist. In the final years of his papacy, especially, he invited all of us to an ever deeper contemplation of the Christian mysteries in his apostolic letter, Tertio Millennio Adveniente (On the Coming of the Third Millennium); he reflected on the essential link between the Eucharist and the Church in his encyclical letter Ecclesia de Eucharistia (The Church Draws Life from the Eucharist); and in his exhortation Mane Nobiscum Domine (Stay With Us, Lord), a moving reflection on how the Church continues to experience the Emmaus story as Christ remains with us until the end of life in the Eucharist. What is this all about? By this way of His presence, our Lord wants to instill in us a passionate love for Himself. Unless we develop a passionate love for our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament, we shall accomplish nothing. Indeed, our Lord loves us passionately in the Eucharist; He loves us blindly without a thought for Himself, devoting Himself entirely for our good. We should love Him as He loves us. The Lord Jesus is saying; my great love for mankind keeps me day and night in the Blessed Sacrament. Saint Catherine of Siena saw far-reaching flames coming from this furnace of love and spreading throughout the world. We have to be aware that the King of Heaven, hidden under the Eucharistic veils, is ready to receive anyone, and nothing in the world can set hearts ablaze with love for God like the Blessed Sacrament. Love the Eucharist passionately. Love our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament with all the zeal with which people love one another in the world. Fix your mind on our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament and ponder on His love. Let this thought take hold of you; let it fascinate you. What? Is it really possible that our Lord loves me to the point of always giving Himself to me without ever growing tired? YES HE DOES. Let us then meet at the Holy Hour on Thursday from 7-8 PM.
