RCIA Part 4 "By their fruit, you shall know them." How Can YOU Disciple a Seeker? Prepared by Sue Dougherty, Coordinator for Religious Education

In the past three weeks, we have been considering the important role of ALL of the faithful, not just the RCIA team, in helping seekers understand what it means to be Catholic. We identified step one of our "job description" to offer hospitality year round; then, to welcome seekers into our worship, our homes, our personal conversations, our community gatherings, so that they witness the presence of God in and through us. They learn who we are by our example. "By their fruits you shall know them" (Mt. 7:16). Third, we invite seekers to encounter Christ in all that we do as a Catholic Community through Word (Scripture), Community (sharing joys and sorrows), Worship (liturgy, adoration), and Service (outreach ministries).

The key point is that *discipleship training happens wherever we gather to be Christians together*. This happens at every Sunday liturgy, but it also happens in the many activities that occur throughout the week. At Holy Comforter, we need only to look at the weekly bulletin or website to see that we offer many opportunities in the areas of Word, Community, Worship, and Witness. Consider the activities provided in last week's bulletin in the framework of this chart:

In which of these (or other) activities are YOU involved? Who do you know who is seeking to learn more about our Catholic faith that you can invite to join you?

The critical role of sponsor: One important way that you can support a seeker is to be a "companion on the journey" with him or her. Just as the two companions on the road to Emmaus came to recognize the risen Christ, so does a sponsor accompany the seeker to help them encounter Christ in the various activities of the community and answer their questions along the way. *"Were not our hearts burning within us?"* the disciples exclaim. A sponsor becomes a companion to the seeker to show him Christ present first and foremost in the liturgy, but also in other areas that might be of interest to him/her. The sponsor is a gift from the community to the person who is going through the initiation process. The sponsor is available to meet regularly with the candidate to talk about their faith experiences, to share their own, and to answer any of the seeker's questions. By getting to know the candidate in this way, the sponsor can attest to the candidate's readiness to receive the Sacraments. The sponsor does not need to have all of the answers, but rather he/she helps to guide the candidate and help them process their experience. *Persons familiar with and active in our community who are willing to be sponsors are needed as inquirers come forward*. Please prayerfully discern if the Holy Spirit is calling YOU to serve in this role. If your heart is burning with a desire to share the presence of Christ in you with another, contact Sue Dougherty today!

If being a sponsor is not for you, at the very least *be present* during the Rites and in the various ministries of Word, Community, Worship, and Witness to welcome newcomers and to bear the light of Christ to them. We can all pray the prayer of the Holy Spirt:

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in us the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit, and we shall be created, and You shall renew the face of the earth.
