
INTERFAITH MOVEMENT PROMOTING ACTION by CONGREGATIONS TOGETHER

From The Pastor A CALL TO ATONEMENT (Part 1)



If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. (1 Cor. 12:26)

At this moment in the history of the Catholic Church, there is anger and a sense of betrayal in the Catholic communities because of the abuse by the Church leadership. The Church of Christ is bleeding! In the awareness of this challenge, our Bishop Barry Knestout, in his letter of August 15, 2018, invited us to pray for all the victims of abuse at the Mass of Atonement that took place on Friday, The Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, at the Cathedral in Richmond. The Bishop invites us to open ourselves to the grace we need to overcome this scourge upon our Church, to prayerfully seek healing and reconciliation with all who have been hurt.

In the same spirit of atonement I encourage special prayers and fasting on Fridays for all those who can join me to pray for healing. The questions we ask; **WHAT IS THIS ATONEMENT ALL ABOUT** and **WHY SHOULD I BE PART OF THIS SINCE I AM INNOCENT**?

In the coming Sundays I will try to deal those questions and find out how best we can work together in this process of healing. What is atonement? Wikipedia gives this definition: "is the concept of a person taking action to correct previous wrong-doing on their part, either through direct action to undo the consequences of that act, equivalent action to do good for others, or some other expression of feelings of remorse". Atonement has been a mystery in the Body of Christ. We have been instructed that Jesus died for our sins, but how and why can this make sense? In order to understand why Jesus, the innocent, died for the guilty, we need to have some ideas from scriptures and how the Jewish community came up with this idea of atonement. Atonement in the Jewish view, means making reconciliation between two parties. The key words in Hebrew: Kaphar which means to cover, appease, and calm down, and Kofer, meaning ransom, are two at the bases of this idea of Atonement. We learn that most of the Old Testament sacrifices were Kofers, a propitiatory that makes atonement for sin. In the Bible atonement is associated with man's sin. God commanded Israel to set aside one day each year, the tenth day of the seventh month, which He called "the day of atonement." (Leviticus 16: 29-30; 23: 27-28) The people were to bring a sin offering, an innocent animal sacrifice "whose blood was brought in to make atonement" (Lev. 16:27). God had said, "For the life of the flesh is in the blood: and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls: for it is the blood that makes an atonement for the soul." (Lev. 17:11) ... and without shedding of blood there is no remission." (Hebrew. 9:22)

What really then motivated the death of Christ? One Theologian observed that; "those who have no understanding or appreciation of Jesus Christ's work for us, lack understanding also on the subject of the nature and effect of sin in all men." Many Scriptures teach clearly that the Atonement of Christ is an expiation of human sin, so that sin is that which made the Atonement necessary. Christ became incarnate in order that He should die for human sin. Whether or not the Son of God would have become Incarnate if man had not sinned, we do not know, nor do we intend to speculate. It is sufficient for us to know that it was sin which made the Cross a must in the experience of the Son of God. (*To be continued----*)
