From The Pastor



MARY OUR STRENGTH ALL THE TIME- CONTINUE TO PRAY THE ROSARY.

We are coming to the end of this special month of October, traditionally dedicated to the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary. What consolation the Rosary brings! Remembering the mysteries of Christ's life and Our Lady's life, we repeat Hail Mary after Hail Mary. Indeed, the mysteries of the Holy Rosary-joyful, sorrowful, glorious and luminous- are the mysteries of our own lives as well. Every time we pray the Rosary, we beg Our Lady to draw us closer to Him who is our Light. We recall that for many saints the Rosary was an indispensable part of their daily prayer. In his biography of Pope Francis, Austen Ivreigh recounts then Cardinal Bergoglio's experience of praying with Saint John Paul II: One afternoon I went to pray the Holy Rosary that the Holy Father was leading. He was in front of us on his knees. With the Holy Father's back to me, I entered into prayer. In the middle of the prayer, I became distracted looking at the pope, and time began to fade away. I began to imagine the young priest, the seminarian, the poet, the worker, the child from Wadowice in exactly the same posture as he was now, praying Hail Mary after Hail Mary. His witness struck me. I felt this man, chosen to quide the Church, was the summation of a path trod together with his Mother in heaven, a path that began in his childhood. And I suddenly realized the weight of the words spoken by the Mother of Guadalupe to Saint Juan Diego, "Do not be afraid. Am I not your mother?" I grasped the presence of Mary in the pope's life. His witness did not get lost in memory. From that time onward I have prayed the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary every day." The Virgin Mary stands near those who suffer, those from whom the world flees, including those who have been put on trial and condemned by all. She is with us in our joys and sorrows. If that is the life we live, how then can we put off the conversation (the Rosary) with our mother? Our Lady is known by many titles, but at the heart of all others is her role as our mother, ever compassionate, tender and loving. The fact that the holy fathers have never put down the rosary sends a clear message that we the flock have to learn from them to pray the rosary daily. On the morning after his election, Pope Francis began by visiting Our Lady, *Populis Romani*, prayed the rosary, and asked for his papacy to be consecrated to Our Lady in Fatima on 13th May. Pope Benedict XVI ended all his homilies and encyclicals with reference to Our Lady, and his last pilgrimage was to her shrine in Loreto, just before the Year of Faith began, and prayed the rosary. St. John Paul II gave everything to Jesus through Mary, as his motto *Totus Tuus* highlighted, inviting us all to that prayer of the rosary.

Our Lady has appeared to her children throughout the ages (e.g. in Mexico City in 1531, in Lourdes in 1858), but never so frequently as during this last century, (e.g. in Fatima, Rwanda, etc.) On all these visits from the mother, the invitation is constant: - PRAY THE ROSARY. The Blessed Virgin Mary has revealed that: "...the Rosary is my Power...It is the weapon which you must make use of in these times of the Great Battle...." October 7, 1571 — In the great battle of Lepanto, Christian defenders held off a Turkish invasion. May 13, 1955 — After 700,000 people agreed to pray the Rosary in Austria, the Soviets mysteriously departed the country on the anniversary date of Fatima. Many battles have been won by this prayer. These days when we have the battle we are dealing with, that of the scandal of abuse in the Church, we need this prayer! So every Rosary which you and I recite has the effect of restricting the action of the Evil One, of drawing souls away from his malicious influence. Our Blessed Mother has said that, "we can do more in one day of intense prayer, than years of discussion." Are we listening? Can we, her children, take on this simple but powerful prayer? Of course we can! LET US CONTINUE TO PRAY THE ROSARY.
