# CHARITY COMPELS US TO PRAY FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

<u>(Part 3)</u>



"..It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins" (2Machabees 12:46).

While we may struggle with the idea of praying for the souls in purgatory, the saints inspire us to intercede for the holy souls in purgatory! Throughout the ages, the devotions, prayers, and practices of the Communion of Saints have been offered up on behalf of souls in purgatory, the Church Suffering. A great number of Saints dedicated their time and efforts to intercede for the holy souls and prayed ceaselessly for their eternal rest. Blessed Mary of Providence from France, received special grace to the vocation for the Holy Souls in Purgatory at an early age. She tried to explain in metaphors that give strange enlightenment in these words: "If one of our friends was imprisoned in a house of fire," she said, "how we should rush to her help. Then think how we should try to deliver the souls in Purgatory." The rest is history. On January 19, 1856 she founded the Society of Helpers of the Holy Souls in Paris, France. St. John Chrysostom, in one his homilies said, "Let us help and commemorate them [souls in purgatory]. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice (Job 1:5), why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them" (Homilies on 1 Corinthians 41:5). The same saint, John Chrysostom, also recommends to every Christian family that they have a box at some convenient place in their home and that they put into it pennies, which will be used to have masses said for the Poor Souls. St. Padre Pio, had a very particular relationship with the Holy Souls; indeed it is reported that they were his frequent visitors - so much so that at one time he said, "I see so many souls from Purgatory that they don't frighten me anymore." And on another occasion when questioned further on the matter, he replied, "More souls of the dead than of the living climb this mountain to attend my Masses and seek my prayers." Padre Pio was one who offered his pains, prayers and sufferings for the release of those in a state of purification, and those souls never ceased to thank him for this. St. Augustine in his book The City of God says, "..... by the prayers of the Holy Church, and by the salvific sacrifice, and by the alms which are given for their spirits, there is no doubt that the dead are aided, that the Lord might deal more mercifully with them than their sins would deserve. The whole Church observes this practice which was handed down by the Fathers: that it prays for those who have died in the communion of the Body and Blood of Christ, when they are commemorated in their own place in the sacrifice itself." St. John Vianney admits that the poor souls in Purgatory are forgotten. He says, "I was recently at a non-Catholic funeral for a relative, and I felt sorry for the relative who had died because in the entire service, not once was there a prayer offered for her soul (this was a Christian Church, which probably presumed that she is already in Heaven). The sad thing is that we can't admit such things. Suppose there was a stain on her soul (as is likely for many): she wouldn't be ready to see God as He is in Heaven. He would have to dim His glory for her, and that would not be just or fair to my relative, or to anybody else entering Heaven with the stain of sin. I pray especially hard for her, as I may be the only one on earth specifically praying for her." The saint continues to say, "We must say many prayers for the souls of the faithful departed, for one must be so pure to enter heaven."(*To be continued..*)
