Virtus (Safety of Children):

Virtus training was held on Oct. 20 for staff and others. We will need to ensure that all staff and volunteers are certified.

Goals for the coming year:

- Increase interest and participation in the Children's Masses. It was changed to 8:30 Mass since more children seem to be present at this Mass. Would like to include "Children's Liturgy of the Word."
- Grow the Youth Ministry program; explore ways to create more interest; find ways to encourage 11th-12th graders to participate after Confirmation. Encourage youth to participate in the Diocesan Summer Work Camps.
- Begin registration for the 2017-18 school year in May of this year. Begin RE classes after Labor Day.
- Consider the possibility of a summer Vacation Bible School Program.
- Explore the possibility of offering child care for children under age 3 during the Sunday Masses.
- With the help of the CF Committee, formalize the Adult Formation program. Work in tandem with the New Evangelization Committee to identify needs.
