FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Parishioners:

Welcome to our fourth report on parish ministries, Liturgy and Worship. I can't imagine speaking of the Church without the worshiping community. The purpose of worship for us Roman Catholics is **the glorification of God and the edification of God's people** as we journey in faith. Thank you for making an effort to come to your church Sunday after Sunday, on feast days of obligation and during the weekdays to gather around the Word and Sacrament to "do this in memory of me." That is, to hold in memory the command of the Lord to gather, to proclaim the Sacred Scriptures, and to "eat this bread and drink the cup" until He comes again in glory. This ministry is valued as the central ministry of our parish community from which we all take our identity and all other activities of the parish flow. I am very grateful in a special way to all of you who volunteer and take on great responsibilities to make our liturgies meaningful, inspirational and lively, bringing us closer to God and to one another. May the Lord reward you abundantly!

The Liturgy and Worship Ministry – James Morrisard, Chair

This ministry provides the opportunity to fulfill our baptismal call of service to one another. Our liturgies utilize the talents and gifts that God has given this community to the fullest extent. Whether participation is through "behind the scenes" preparation and planning or through a public role of service within the Mass, a parishioner's contributions help our liturgies to be truly life-giving celebrations. The ministry plans all our ordinary and extraordinary liturgies and schedules the Masses for feast days and holy days of obligation.

Under this ministry are the following committees:

Music: Daniel Kirkland, Minister

The Music Ministry provides music for all of our weekend liturgies and Holy Days, as well as for weddings, funerals and other special occasions, upon request. Daniel is responsible for choosing the sacred music for weekend Masses, scheduling cantors, and recruiting members for the choir. There is a current need for additional voices, especially women's voices, to strengthen the group. Daniel is developing a children's choir to sing at the 8:30 am Children's Mass, the first Sunday of every month. With expansion of the music in mind, Daniel plans to incorporate musical instruments on an individual basis.

Lectors: Kevin Connally, Coordinator

Lectors proclaim the Word of the Lord during the Liturgy. A lector should have a passion for Scripture. Six new Lectors began serving in 2016, which has helped to offset attrition. Recruitment efforts will continue due to a shortage of readers for the Saturday 5 pm Mass. The target for scheduling is an average of once a month over the year — with a reasonable time between assignments. However, this has been difficult due to the small number of lectors. Existing Lectors may be coached, as needed, to improve focus on the concept of proclaiming. New recruits are always welcome. Training in the specifics of the ministry is provided as the need arises.

Sacristans: Suzanne Bailey, Chair

The sacristan ministry is a group of approximately twenty dedicated volunteers who work behind the scenes to prepare the worship space for the celebration of the sacraments each week. Duties range from polishing, light cleaning, washing and ironing of altar linens and altar cloths, and replacing candles and altar cloths as needed. The cloths used at the altar during the Eucharistic celebration are treated with the utmost care and respect, as they are used in the preparation and celebration of the sacred mysteries. Accordingly, guidelines are provided for their care. All are welcome to participate based on the time and talents or limitations of each individual person.

Extraordinary Ministers of The Eucharist: Michelle Edwards, Coordinator

There are 44 Extraordinary Ministers responsible for helping the celebrating priest distribute the Body and Blood of Christ at the weekend and Holy Day Masses. In 2016 a few ministers left and two new ministers were added. Fr. Joseph Mary procured distinctive new medals for each Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist, and a protocol was established for distributing low gluten hosts. Training in the specifics of this ministry is provided.

Pastoral Care: Barbara Rainville, Coordinator

This team of dedicated volunteers take communion to members of the parish who are home-bound. The team will identify a need for Anointing of the sick and notify the pastor accordingly. In any given week twenty to thirty people receive Holy Communion at home, as well as in health-care and assisted living facilities. The activities are coordinated across all three parishes in Charlottesville to avoid unnecessary overlap. An annual gathering of all Eucharistic ministers from the three parishes is planned for Lent 2017 at Church of the Incarnation.

Altar Servers: Patrick Mason, Coordinator

With the assistance of Father Joseph Mary and Sue Dougherty, Coordinator of Religious Education, Patrick has trained four new altar servers. Recruitment among children over the age of eight, as well as adults is on-going. The need is still great for more committed volunteers and to form an altar server guild.

Ushers: Jim Morrisard, Coordinator

There are 17 Ushers/Greeters, with a current need for volunteers at the 5 pm Saturday Mass. One couple has to be scheduled every week and more volunteers are very much welcome to join the team.

Bereavement and Hope Ministry: Connie Flamm, Coordinator

This ministry helps family members who have lost a loved one cope with their grief as they make arrangements for funeral Liturgical services. Members of the ministry are responsible for preparing the worship guide for the funeral and providing assistance during the funeral, by serving as a Eucharistic Minister, Usher, Lector or Altar Server.
