LIMITATIONS TO OUR GROWTH (part 7)

"But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me." (2 Cor.22:9)

It is a commonplace to observe that the saints were not those who never fell, but those who never gave in to their falls. We come to another aspect in life that sometimes limits our spiritual growth and that is **Discouragement.** Often times when one observes a failure to grow in others or in one's own life, we becomes discouraged. When things don't progress as quickly as one would like, one can become frustrated and tempted to give up. Obviously, as long as this attitude is present, growth will not occur. Discouragement is a temptation "common to man" (1 Corinthians 10:13). And, in dealing with it, we sometimes need tenderness while at other times we need toughness. Either way discouragement is not to be tolerated, it's to be fought. Jesus describes this as the challenge of the stony ground in the parable of the Sower: "But he who received the seed on stony places, this is he who hears the word and *immediately receives it with joy; yet he has no root in himself, but endures only for a while. For when tribulation or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he stumbles."* (Mat. 13: 20-21). My spiritual director once told me "When we feel discouraged we want comfort, which is right to feel. **But, the comforts we often turn to are ways to avoid our fears rather than ways to muster our courage to face and overcome them. When this happens, discouragement simply becomes a sinful indulgence in unbelief; no different than indulging in lust or anger or other sins of unbelief."**

The fact that one is discouraged is not wrong within itself. We all become discouraged from time to time. Even Jesus was discouraged occasionally. But the key is to keep going and not let whatever it is that is so discouraging hinder our growth in any area of our life: spiritual, physical and social. Realizing that growth also takes time, Paul said, "And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart." (Galatians 6:9). Growth will come "in due season." I am reminded of the child who can hardly wait to grow up. First, he can't wait to become a teenager. Then, he wants to be sixteen so that he can drive. As he reaches that milestone, he wants to be an adult, and so it keeps going. We tell them, "Be patient, growth takes time." It is easy to understand that physical growth takes time, but when it comes to other areas of life we desire the "highway" speed limit. We want growth and we want it right now. Well, growth doesn't work that way. Let us keep in mind the steps of the process of growth and allow maturity to take place.

Now the question comes, "What can we do about these *LIMITATIONS TO OUR GROWTH?*" Scripture tells us: "*Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.*" *(Hebrews 12:1-2).* Note how we are called upon to lay aside every weight and run with endurance. (*To be continued*).
