DEALING WITH THE LIMITATIONS TO OUR GROWTH (part 11)

"So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God." (1 Cor.10:31)

God has done marvelous things for us since He brought us into existence! The *love* he has shown us in Jesus Christ is beyond our ability to understand. The *joy* he gives us in salvation is beyond our ability to express. The *peace* he gives is also beyond our comprehension. Words simply fail to describe adequately the experience of God's blessings we have in Jesus Christ. How shall we respond to these magnificent blessings? The Psalmist in Psalm 116 has this to say; "What shall I return to the LORD for all his goodness to me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the LORD." (12-13) Having embraced Jesus and seeing all that he is doing with your life then, does not your heart say with Paul, "It is my eager expectation and hope that I shall not at all be ashamed, but that with full courage now as always *Christ will be magnified* in my body whether by life or by death?"

Therefore, I say it is the mark of all God's true children that we seek to glorify God in all we do or plan to do as a way of being grateful to Him. King David said, "I will magnify God with thanksgiving." The word "magnify" according to the Biblical scholars can be used in two different senses. It can mean; make something appear greater than it is, as with a microscope or a magnifying glass. Or it can mean; make something that may seem small or insignificant appear to be as great as it really is. This is what our planning for the 2020 need to be focused on to "magnify" God's glory. First, with what we do in our personal, family and community life. Secondly, in what we do with our Liturgy and Worship. Third, in what we can do with our Church building, both inside and out. Fourth, in all of what we do in all our ministries. Just seeking to magnify the LORD. When King David says, "I will magnify God with thanksgiving," he does not mean: "I will make a small God look bigger than he is." He means: "I will make a big God begin to look as big as he really is." We are not called to be "microscopes", but "telescopes," as it were. As disciples of Jesus we are not called to be con-men who magnify their product out of all proportion to reality, when they know the competitor's product is far superior. There is nothing and nobody superior to God. And so the calling of those who love God is to make his greatness begin to look as great as it really is. The whole duty of a disciple can be summed up like this: feel, think, and act in a way that will make God look as great as he really is. One preacher once said; "Be a telescope for the world of the infinite starry wealth of the glory of God." That God is great in every way and that greatness is to be valued, should be obvious to everyone. As the letter to the Romans says; "Ever since the creation of the world, his invisible nature, namely, his eternal power and deity, has been clearly perceived in the things that have been made. So men are without excuse for, although they knew God, they did not glorify him as God or give him thanks. (Romans 1:20-21) (To be continued--).
