### From the Pastor

### ALLELUIA THE TOMB IS EMPTY (# 2)

### "The other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed" (Jn.20:8).

There are "many infallible proofs" of the bodily resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ, but the testimony of the empty tomb is the most conclusive of all. Jesus had been buried, with the tomb sealed and guarded by a watch of Roman soldiers. Yet on the third day of His burial, on the morning of the first day of the week, the body was no longer there, and the empty tomb still stands today as an unanswerable proof that the Lord Jesus rose from the dead.

The disciple whom Jesus loved immediately believed in the resurrection when he saw the linen clothes lying still as they had been, yet in a now-empty tomb, though he and the others had all apparently forgotten His promise to rise after three days (Mat. 20:17-19). Neither had they understood the prophecies in the Old Testament that He would rise again (Ps. 16:10; Is. 53: 10).But very soon they would all understand and go forth into all the world as Spirit-filled proclaimers of the great truth of Christ's death and bodily resurrection. The body of Jesus was certainly no longer in the tomb, nor could it be produced anywhere else.

Many skeptics have tried to avoid the truth of the resurrection by saying that Jesus did not actually die on the cross. The tomb was empty, they say, because Jesus recovered from his wounds in the cool of the tomb and then went back to be with His disciples and friends. Something completely wrong. We should never forget that the empty tomb has proved beyond reasonable doubt that Christ rose from the dead after suffering and dying for our sins. His resurrection in turn proves that He is the God of all creation, for only God can conquer death.

At this point it will be worthwhile to look into what the resurrection of Jesus Christ stands to effect in our lives. And what are the benefits of the resurrection of Jesus Christ in the life of an active Christian. In I Cor.15:14-18 St. Paul did say among other things that if Christ did not rise from the dead we have nothing to preach and you have nothing to believe. He also said that if Christ did not rise from the dead then our faith is meaningless. Hence the rising from the dead is a confirmation of our faith and we are alive again.

The resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ is a clear indication of the fact that sin and death have been conquered. We are no longer subjected to the law of sin and death, because the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set us free (Romans 8:2). The resurrection moved the stone of sin that covered us from receiving the light of God's grace. There is a sense wherein we see the tomb as representing our hearts and the stone as sin covering it from divine contact. The resurrection of Jesus Christ removes this obstacle and we are given access again to God's mercy and forgiveness.

It means that we have been liberated from the stranglehold of our enemies. Those who have been after us are now been pursued by God. God is now troubling our troubles and worrying our worries. Power has changed hands and we have been lifted to a new level. The tears of the passion have given way to the joy of the resurrection. In fact we have been liberated from three conditions: As children we have a game called "stand-still". Those who play this game usually tell each other to stand-still and the person is expected to stand still or pause until the person releases you. There are actually many people out there who are standing still not because they want to stand-still but because the devil has orchestrated it in some ways. The power of the resurrection is releasing such people who choose to listen and move forward in faith. (*To be continued--).*
