#### FROM THE PASTOR 2017



"For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me" (Jn.6:38)

The end of one year and the beginning of another is usually a time to look back to what has been and to look forward to what can be. This includes to looking into the positive as well as into the negative things. To look forward to what can be or should be possible is also an important exercise. For us the Children of God and disciples of Jesus Christ we have one vision in view by the mission statement give to us by the Master; "My nourishment comes from doing the will of God, who sent me, and from finishing his work." (4:34) If this can be our focus in 2017 we will never fail to accomplish the mission for which we were born.

The prophet Joel, inspired by God, spoke as follows: "I will pour out my Spirit on all mankind. Your old people shall dream dreams and your young people shall see visions." It is important to dream, to try to imagine how, for example, we can help in some small way to make Holy Comforter the best parish ever.
