CHRISTIAN FORMATION AND EVANGELIZATION: HAND-IN-HAND

"Our hearts are restless until they rest in you, Oh Lord."

St. Augustine

"These are powerful words. They direct us toward Christ in a simple way that speaks to everyone, for everyone has a restless heart. Pope Francis tells us that Augustine is speaking of three types of restlessness: "the restlessness of spiritual seeking, the restlessness of the encounter with God, the restlessness of love." This restlessness, whether we recognize it or not, is a desire to know God and to have a deeper relationship with Him. None of this is easy, but God is always there for us. He is waiting with open arms, just as he waited for Augustine in his conversion to Christianity, so that we might rest in Him.

Either consciously or unconsciously, we are all directed toward Christ. That is what moves us to come to Mass each week, to partake in the Eucharist, and to seek solace and reassurance in prayer. This "relationship of love" with God that Augustine speaks about is what our hearts long to have. If the Canaanite woman, a foreigner, in today's Gospel recognized Jesus as healer and savior, should not we be drawn to Him in the same way? As with any relationship, growing closer to God is an ongoing process of knowing each other intimately, spending time with each other, and being consciously aware of how our actions impact one another.

In our Catholic tradition, we have always recognized the importance of passing on the faith to our children. Most of us remember our Sunday School (aka "CCD") classes growing up and hopefully made some attempt to ensure that our children have had the same opportunity. But do we see our own need for ongoing catechesis as critical to both growing our relationship with God and living out our call to discover and use the charisms with which we have been gifted to help others do the same? Yes, Christian formation is not just for children; it's for every baptized Catholic to embrace and support! If we are called as disciples of Christ to share the Gospel message, we must first, as St. Augustine implores, "know myself" by allowing God to shed light on the person He has created me to be. How can I grow in my own relationship with the Lord and then help others do the same? Here are some ways:

- Participate in the various Adult Formation opportunities that will be offered this year. Our recent survey suggested that you, the parishioners of Holy Comforter, (based on a small number of respondents) are interested in learning more about your Catholic Faith (Scripture and Tradition), how to strengthen prayer life, and a deeper understanding of liturgy, the sacraments, and Catholic Social Teaching. Recognizing that our diverse demographic has a variety of spiritual needs and interests, we hope to offer a variety of opportunities for everyone.
- Prayerfully assess your spiritual gifts and consider how you can get involved Can you host a small group in your home? Can you be a catechist for the children? Are you able to assist with Youth Ministry? Can you lead a Bible study or facilitate another book study? Do you have technology skills to help us? Can you invite someone who has fallen away from the church to return? Can you help with the RCIA program? Can you organize and oversee a nursery so that parents with young children can prayerfully participate in Mass or an adult class? Have you told us what your specific spiritual needs are so that we can support you?

An encounter with God and His love is an ongoing, intentional process that begins with ourselves, extends to our families, our church community, and then to the larger community where we live and work. Filled with the love of God, we cannot keep it for ourselves! EACH ONE OF US, as members of the family of God, has a responsibility to seek Him and to support one another on the journey. Only then will we and the world we live in truly rest in God.
