# FROM OUR PASTOR PLANNING TO CELEBRATE 140 YEARS OF HOLY COMFORTER PARISH IN 2020



In preparation for the celebrations of the 140 years since Holy Comforter came into existence I call upon every parishioner to begin looking into those steps that will help us to celebrate with meaning the joy of this milestone. I consider that the place to begin our planning is to look into "BREAKING THE BARRIERS" that prevent the parish, the families and the individual to breathe, grow and move forward in FAITH, HOPE AND CHARITY. We need to look into all areas that make us proud of our faith. The image, above, of the brick wall broken-through very significantly conveys the message of what I suggest we focus on at this moment. We need to break through our parish "walls" to allow light to come inside; to allow the rays of Christ the Sun and the Son of God into Holy Comforter. Our parish ministries and committees need the light to see clearly what we need to CHANGE and RESTORE for the GLORY OF GOD and for the PROSPERITY of our parish.

I guess we might know what to do and even how to do it, but taking action requires courage — the ability to withstand fear, humiliation, and discomfort. We're conditioned from childhood to avoid unpleasant feelings. Nothing stirs those feelings more than taking risks, which is necessary to realize our dreams. It's no wonder change can feel so hard. We must position ourselves in the right environment and apply ourselves to foster growth. Scripture gives us several principles we can apply to our own lives to help us stay motivated and grow. Here are a few:

#### 1. People who are moving toward growth live daily with the end in view.

As Christians, most of us have this backwards. We tend to think that our goal in life is to go to Heaven when we die. But Heaven isn't our goal. Heaven is our *destination*! Our *goal* is to *become more like Christ*. God's goal for each one of us is to "all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and <u>become mature</u>, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." (Ephesians 4:13). God's desire for us is to grow, increasing in maturity. He wants to take every, opportunity, situation, relationship, and struggle and work it together for good for the good of each member and our Church as a whole.

# 2. People who are growing make a personal commitment to grow.

In a marriage relationship, couples don't decide to stick with your spouse through thick and thin *before* you make a commitment. Neither do you figure out *if* you are going to be committed *after* 50 years of marriage. You go for it without knowing everything that will happen. The same is true with our commitment to grow in other areas of our lives. We don't wait until we're ready and mature to make the decision to grow. **Growth requires commitment**. God requires a personal commitment to Him in order to grow. Jesus said, *"Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."* (*Luke 9:23*) .When we sign up to follow Jesus in baptism, we make a commitment to place our trust in Him, dying to our own agenda and goals. We must trust that He will show us what to do as life happens. Above all we are led by the Holy Spirit since we are in particular members of the HOLY SPIRIT, THE COMFORTER. (*To be continued-*)
