FROM OUR PASTOR PLANNING TO CELEBRATE 140 YEARS OF HOLY COMFORTER PARISH IN 2020



WHAT SHOULD BE OUR DRIVING FORCE?

All our blessings come from God the Father through God the Son, while all truth becomes living and operative in the life of us believers through God the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the 'driving force' on the path to salvation. But, we must understand that the Holy Spirit is not just a force; He is a Person who speaks (Acts 13:2), teaches (John 14:26), strives with sinners (John 16:8) and helps our infirmities (Romans 8:26). Sometimes he is grieved (Ephesians 4:30) and even resisted (Acts 7:51). That "Force" helps us to grow, but not overnight. We have a growth process much like a tree, rooted in faith; we develop the disciplines for spiritual maturity, and discover our purpose for fruitful productivity. Programs become outdated, expensive to run, ineffective, exhausting to volunteers, unfamiliar to guests. What is needed then is to allow that Spirit to move us into that direction that will please God and benefit our salvation. We don't need to be a "meeting-oriented" community, because sometimes that makes people passive spectators and leaves no time for ministry. We have to meet more needs as the Holy Spirt leads us.

It is my hope that we can see and understand that growth in the Christian's life is something that is expected. Whether it be the growing that every newborn in Christ needs (1 Peter 2:1) or continued growth throughout your life as a Christian (2 Peter 3:18), growth is a key element to being pleasing to God. If that be the case, why is that so many either fail to grow or their development is much slower than it ought to be (Hebrews 5:12)? The main reason can be attributed to the barriers and obstacles Satan puts in our way. He knows that if he can find something to put in our way it could keep us from becoming what we ought to be. If his efforts persist he will cause us to be lost. We must take every step we can to remove all barriers and obstacles the devil puts on our path so that we may become spiritually sound, physically fit for the glory of God, and socially inviting so we can enjoy with one another the blessings the Lord has bestowed on our parish community of Holy Comforter.

One barrier to break is **indifference**. Perhaps you have heard the joke about the man who was asked by a preacher if he knew about the dangers of ignorance and indifference. He responded by saying, "I don't know and I don't care." While such may cause one to giggle, the truth is, many possess one of these attitudes, or both, and that is NOT funny. Such a barrier will get in the way of our spiritual, physical and social growth as a community. The fact is that we may fail to grow because we simply do not *care* as we ought to. We may know that we ought to grow and often see what we need to do. Some may even talk about it in the corridors, worrying about how we seem to be stagnant but then we do not care *enough* to do something about it.

As you may be aware, indifference is a matter of the heart. It is an indication that your heart is not spiritually pure. At best, indifference means that you serve God with divided loyalty. Jesus said that such is unacceptable. He said, "No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. (Matthew 6:24)" It was indifference that made Laodicea such a distasteful church to the Lord (Revelation 3:15-16). Indifference caused the five virgins to be left outside of their wedding because they were unprepared (Matthew 25:1-13)..Indifference will manifest itself sooner or later. It will be seen in unfinished projects, poor execution of tasks, slow learning, and unpreparedness. When one member of the community doesn't care it shows up and affects all us! Because we are one body of Christ, if one part of the body suffers, the whole body is affected. (To be continued...)
