FAST AND ABSTINENCE

(From the United States Conference on Catholic Bishops) Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.

Lenten Reflection 2018 CHOOSE TO SUFFER FROM 'THE FOOLISHNESS OF LOVE'



"We are fools for Christ..." (1Corinthian 4:10)

This year, Easter Sunday will fall on April 1st – which is considered 'all fools' day! And interestingly, Ash Wednesday, February 14th, the beginning of Lent, has fallen on St. Valentine's Day. All of this sounds weird and exciting at the same time, as a number of people have observed. Someone commented that couples could hold hands, get ashes together, and take on a "couple's penance" for the season of Lent by sacrificing together. Looking at our parish theme for the month of February which is "following in the footsteps of the Holy Family," I can say this year's Lenten season can bring forth great, wonderful fruits that can hold the couples and our families strongly together. You can abstain from the same things, together as a couple and as a family. This can be a tremendous experience, because you will receive support and encouragement from your significant other when you are feeling a bit lazy and unmotivated to keep to your penance. As experience has shown, it is always easier doing difficult things together than when you are just alone.

The opportunity the Church has this year is to emphasize the type of love that ought always to mark our faith and characterize our Lents. St. Paul said; "We are fools for Christ, but you are so wise in Christ! We are weak, but you are strong! You are honored, we are dishonored!" (1Cor. 4:10) As Christians, we should love God more than any man has ever loved any woman. We should be willing to sacrifice for him more. We should be willing to make more time for him than those in love make for each other. We should be more passionate about pleasing him than any boyfriend seeks to make happy the woman to whom he wishes to propose.

Lent is a time when we can focus above all on whether God's love for us and our love for him are as they ought to be. As Pope Emeritus Benedict VI used to stress, "Lent is not about making minor course corrections in our lives, but about experiencing a radical and total conversion." We should become crazier with the love of the one who has loved us to the point of shedding blood!

Why not as a family become Lenten prayer buddies and make it your goal to pray for each other's intentions during the entire season in an even more powerful way. Undertake acts of charity together. It could be visiting a shelter or volunteering at the soup kitchen, take on some community service, teaching poor children, or even getting involved in some other parish ministry together.

If you have had some differences in the last couple of months, take this opportunity to sit down together on a given day, maybe after the Stations of the Cross, and talk about it and resolve it. Decide on some concrete steps to follow during the season of Lent to strengthen your relationship. Ask the real St. Valentine to assist you with his prayers.

There are so many different and creative ways to celebrate love on during this season. Remember this season has a somber mood characterized by the mysteries of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord, which was God's ultimate Act of Love for each one of us. *There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends (John 15:13)*. Let this season help you to rediscover the spiritual force of God in your relationship, and to begin living out your love for each other in more Christ-like ways. Probably there is powerful romance in that. (*To be continued...*)
