FAST AND ABSTINENCE

(From the United States Conference on Catholic Bishops) Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.

From The Pastor Lenten Reflection 2018, Part 4 CHOOSE <u>TO SUFFER FROM 'THE FOOLISHNESS OF LOVE'</u>



"We preach Christ crucified, to Jews a stumbling block and to Gentiles foolishness." (1 Cr.1:23)

When we look at Christ crucified we learn some lessons about love: Love is planned, love is about God, love is about man, and love is sacrificial. The cross is the way in which God shows his love for us, so love has a God-facing component, it often has a man- or woman-facing component, but the cross was also sacrificial. It was undeserved and costly. Sometimes people think the cross was an accident, sometimes people don't understand exactly what happened there, so we need to understand the cross better to understand God's love better, and the cross is a lens we can use to refocus on what is means to love and to be loved.

The modern media presents the wisdom of the world as the solution to all of our problems. The writers of the news magazines, TV news networks, radio and TV talk shows refuse to accept the word of the cross as the means of God's saving power. The cross of Jesus Christ is a scandal to them. They rationalize it as being too cruel and rate it anti-Semitic. Their attitude is to get rid of the message that Jesus Christ was indeed the atoning sacrifice of God to deal with the punishment of our guilt. The apostle Paul wrote centuries ago, "For the word of the cross is to those who are perishing foolishness, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God..." (1 Cr. 1:18). Does that not give us pause in this season now before us? Think of it: humiliation and agony. This was the path Jesus chose with which to reach out for you and for me because he loves. Isn't that "foolishness"? You see, this thing we call sin, but which we so tragically minimize, breaks the dignity for which we were created. It brings indignity to our essence and pain to our existence. It separates us from God and brings confusion into our relationships. On the way to the cross so many years ago, Jesus took the ultimate indignity and the ultimate pain to bring us back to the dignity of a relationship with God and the healing of our souls. Will you remember that this was done for you and receive this gift this season of Lent? Human wisdom could never discover the method of salvation, nor the compliance to receive it. Lost sinners are saved not because they are wiser, better, or distinguished in some way, but simply because God chose to demonstrate his love for them and called them by His means.

The purpose of saving sinners by grace through faith in Jesus Christ took this path so that God would receive all the glory. If you have anything to glory in, let it be in the LORD. Wisdom that comes from God leads to man's salvation. He created us out of love and out of love He saved us; in all His wisdom. We are commissioned to live and preach the gospel of love, not in cleverness of speech, that the cross of Christ should not be made void. For the word of the cross is to those who are perishing foolishness, but to those who are being saved it is the power of God. Our greatest weakness is not an enemy from without but one from within. It is our own weak wills that cause us to stumble. But Jesus Christ frees us from the foolishness of sin and the weakness of our selves. This is the very reason the apostle Paul went on to say that he preached Jesus Christ as one crucified, which was both the *power of God* and the wisdom. (*To be continued...*)
