

TIME FOR NEW LIFE IN JESUS IS NOW (Part 5)

"Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life" (Rm. 6:4).

Thinking about shaking things up in your life? Then be ready for some transformation. I love the story of the metamorphosis of the caterpillar destined to be a cool butterfly. On the outside, the cocoon itself appears calm; however, on the inside a struggle to change is taking place.

A number of people fly to Spain to experience a two-week personal pilgrimage by walking the famous path of the *El Camino Santiago* or the way of St. James. Any person who has ever done this with very serious intentions, feel the call to make some significant changes. If you are paying attention, you can feel it in your soul when it's time for change. Consider this: if you are operating from the same old thoughts, using the same familiar language and existing in the same prehistoric environment, you have become outdated. A change is needed.

The first thing you must do is desire to change so much that you are willing to give up that old person you use to be. Start with getting real concerning your pain and decide what you really want instead. Life is lived out in seasons, so ask yourself, am I entering a season where change is needed? If so, create a plan, inform yourself on your resources, and lace up your boots to go on your own personal pilgrimage. Two, taking on the butterfly story again, when the butterfly immerges from its cocoon, its wings are folded and soft. It is in its expanding and flapping that it becomes strong and able to fly. In other words, when you are in motion you get stronger and create energy to perform. Are you prepared to take yourself to an unfamiliar territory? If so, talk is cheap. You must take action and unleash yourself today. When you've experienced transformation, it is because the healing of hurts, habits, and hang-ups have taken place. Change is never easy, but necessary; you will know when it's occurring because your mind and heart will meet at the intersection of self-love, which releases the ability to love others. So take up your marching orders and head up the trail for a transformed life. As a new creation by the Savior, we do not have to live in the old corruption of sin. Far too many people are running around, today claiming to be recreated beings, new creations in Christ, and yet they are still living in the old corruption of sin. If they did not say so, you would never know they were Christians. They live act and talk just like people who are still living in bondage to the world but there has never been a change in their lives. I believe one of two things is wrong with a person who claims to be a Christian but does not exhibit a changed life.

In his letter to the Romans, chapter 8, Paul stresses the importance of the indwelling presence of the *Holy Spirit* in the life of the believer; it is only by the power of the Holy Spirit whereby the believer can overcome his status quo of his/her life of sin disposition and live a life of holiness. He encourages us to walk according to the Spirit (8:2-4), set your mind on the things of the Spirit (8:5-8), put to death the deeds of the body by the Spirit (8:13), be led by the Spirit (8:14), know the Fatherhood of God by the Spirit (8:15-17), hope in the Spirit (8:23-25) and pray in the Spirit (8:26-27). In other passages, Paul mentions Be filled with the Spirit (Eph 5:18), Serve in the Spirit (Rom 7:6; 15:16) and Love by the Spirit (Rom 15:30; Gal 5:22-23; Col 1:8). With all this God wants us to just be committed to walking in the newness of life.
