



BEHOLD YOUR SON......HERE IS YOUR MOTHER (Part 3)



"When Jesus then saw His mother, and the disciple whom He loved standing nearby, He said to His mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" Then He said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." (Jn.19:26-27)

Jesus tells John, his beloved disciple, **"Here is, your mother!"** and further, John took Mary into his own home once Jesus died. We may ask; **"Why did Jesus entrust Mary to the apostle John instead of to His relatives?"** What we know is that Mary was most certainly a widow at this point in her life and also probably an older woman. Though she had relatives, Jesus chose John to provide care for Mary after His death. **Why?** John was certainly a beloved disciple of Jesus and he demonstrated his faithfulness and commitment to Jesus. Jesus knew John and he found him to be trustworthy to be able to take on such a great responsibility of taking care of His mother. As the only son in His family, Jesus had a cultural obligation to care for His mother and He passed that obligation on to one of His closest friends. John would have certainly obeyed this command. This passage however most of all is reminder that, like John, I am a beloved of Christ. And, like John and St. Joseph before him, I shouldn't be afraid to invite Mary into my home, and into my prayer life as my Mother. Nothing gives Mary greater joy than when we obey her Son! I feel compelled to intentionally invite Mary to watch over me as a disciple of Christ and to cover me and my family and flock in her loving mantle of grace and peace. I am not afraid to call her, my "Mama."

According to St. Pope John Paul II. These particularly moving words from Jesus to Mary and the disciple John, are a "revelation scene:" they reveal the deep sentiments of the dying Christ and contain a great wealth of meaning for Christian faith and spirituality. At the end of his earthly life, as he addressed his Mother and the disciple he loved, the crucified Messiah establishes a new relationship of love between Mary and Christians. "Jesus completes his sacrifice by entrusting Mary to John. The words of the dying Jesus actually show that his first intention was not to entrust his Mother to John, but to entrust the disciple to Mary and to give her a new maternal role. Moreover, the description "woman", also used by Jesus at the wedding in Cana to lead Mary to a new dimension of her existence as Mother, shows how the Savior's words are not the fruit of a simple sentiment of filial affection but are meant to be put at a higher level. Although Jesus' death causes Mary deep sorrow, it does not in itself change her normal way of life: in fact, in departing from Nazareth to start his public life, Jesus had already left his Mother alone. Moreover, the presence at the Cross of her relative, Mary of Clopas, allows us to suppose that the Blessed Virgin was on good terms with her family and relatives, by whom she could have been welcomed after her Son's death." The Holy Father continues to say that; "Jesus' words acquire their most authentic meaning in the context of his saving mission. Spoken at the moment of the redemptive sacrifice, they draw their loftiest value precisely from this sublime circumstance." In fact, after Jesus' statements to his Mother, the Evangelist adds a significant clause: "Jesus, knowing that all was now finished..." (Jn 19:28), as if he wished to stress that he had brought his sacrifice to completion by entrusting his Mother to John, and in him to all men, whose Mother she becomes in the work of salvation."
