#### **OUTREACH**

Holy Comforter gratefully acknowledges receipt of a \$2,500 grant from the Diocese of Richmond's "Fuel and Hunger" program. The grant comprises roughly 10% of Outreach expenditures, excluding salaries, for the Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry during the calendar year. The balance—more than \$22,000 last fiscal year—of the Outreach food budget comes from parishioners who stuff the envelope for the special collection every second Sunday. Thank you Diocese, thank you parishioners, for enabling Outreach to feed more than 16,000 people per year out of the Holy Comforter basement.

# THE POWER OF BABY JESUS



"And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, 'All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth.'" (Mt. 28:18)

"Sustaining all things by his powerful word." (Heb. 1:3). A recent issue of U.S. News and World Report says that the United States will soon launch a space station into orbit in an attempt to define gravity. That's an interesting thought. We've known what gravity is for hundreds of years, but we don't know how it works and we really don't know what it is or where it comes from. There is a vast movement in science today seeking to discover what makes the universe hold together. What is the power behind the power behind the power? What makes the universe hold together? Our faith tells us that Jesus Christ is the power behind all power. He holds the universe in place by his powerful word. Even now Jesus is "sustaining" the whole universe. All things hold together in him and for him and by him. His power is greater than nuclear power and his force is mightier than the mystical Force of the Star Wars movies. His might is mightier than the might of all the mighty men on earth.

Think of about that! Were he to say the word, all the "powerful of this world", would be no more. Just a word and we would all perish. Do you realize that if Jesus stopped thinking about you, you would cease to exist? You owe your next breath to the fact that Jesus Christ is thinking about you. He sustains you so that you can breathe. Without him, you would not be reading these words. For: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (In. 1:1-5) It is ironic to consider that even atheists must use the power he provides to deny his very existence. They owe their existence to the One they so vigorously deny. Jesus is the nucleus of creation and "the glue of the galaxies;" The Heir of All Things; The Creator of the Universe; The Exact Representation of God's Nature; The Sustainer of All Things; Our Savior. Then somebody said this about baby Jesus: "To the architect he is the chief cornerstone. To the banker he is the hidden treasure. To the baker he is the living bread. To the builder he is the sure foundation. To the doctor he is the great physician. To the educator he is the master teacher. To the farmer he is the Lord of the harvest. To the florist he is the lily of the valley "

Oh my! What a power he holds! Let me encourage you to think carefully about who Jesus really is. Check it out for yourself! Take the time to check things out. Read the New Testament. Make an effort to be focused on him. But whatever you do, don't be casual about Christ. What you believe about the Baby of Bethlehem is a life and death matter with eternal implications.
