I WALK WITH JESUS (Part 2)



"Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Mt. 11:28-30)

One of the most discouraging and depressing places to be is tired AND alone. Most of us have been in that position at one time or another in our life journey. We are overwhelmed by life and by our circumstances. We are drowning and there is no one to throw us a lift preserver. In these situations, Jesus comes to us and invites us to lay our burdens down on him! What a beautiful invitation from Jesus! The above passage is worth reading over and over and memorizing so that it can easily be reflected upon during those more difficult moments in life. We have those moments when we feel overwhelmed and burdened. We could be burdened by some tragedy in life, or it could be we are burdened by the small and monotonous aspects of life.

As we walk with Jesus, we are bound to experience his compassion and witness him healing those who are ill. Matthew points out that; "Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness among the people." (Mt. 4:23) However, one of the greatest daily burdens is that of our own sin. Whatever the case may be, Jesus wants us to hear and believe these words: "Come to me..." He says. "Come to me no matter what is going on in your life. Come to me without hesitation and without fear." When walking with the Lord you will grow in your awareness of sin in your life and your need for a Savior. More and more we will grow in hatred for our sins and want to rid our lives of them. More and more we will confess and forsake our sins. We can't walk with the Lord if we're living in darkness. You can't have God and evil. St. John remind us this: "If we say we have fellowship with him and yet keep on walking in the darkness, we are lying and not practicing the truth. But if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin." (1 Jn. 1:6) Does it mean that walking with Jesus will remove all hardship from our lives? No, not really. What it means is that coming to Jesus will enable us to endure and walk through any hardship we encounter in life.

We should always remember that the Son of God came and took on our human nature and all that goes along with being human. And though He never sinned, He allowed Himself to experience the effects of sin and the burden it imposes. So as God, He is able to look us in the eye and tell us that He understands our hardships because He lived them. He lived them out of love for us so that He could help us endure, joyfully, all we face in life.

Let us appreciate this gentle and glorious invitation from Jesus. Let Him enter into whatever it is that burdens you. Let Him carry your heavy yoke and take the gentle yoke He has prepared for you. It is time to surrender your life to Jesus as you continue this journey with Him. (To be continued...)
