I WALK WITH JESUS (Part 3)



"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me" (Jn. 10:27).

Have you ever heard the voice of Jesus? I am convinced that we are too easily distracted in the rush of this modern world in which we live. There are so many choices. There are so many distractions all demanding our time and our attention. Sadly, it seems that we only hear what we want to hear, and we often completely tune out the voice of the one we call our Lord and Master. We do not take time to hear His voice. Maybe we do not really have as trusting a relationship with Jesus as we may think we have. How much time do you set aside for the one you call your Savior? How much time do you spend with the one you call Lord? Do you hear his voice? Are you tuned in so you will hear his voice? Psalm 46:10 encourages us to be still, let go, cease striving, and know that He is God. In Psalm 37:7 we are called to "be still before the Lord and wait patiently for Him." There is a deep inner knowing in our spirits that each of us can experience when we quiet our flesh and our minds. Practicing the art of biblical meditation helps silence the outer noise and distractions demanding our attention. If I fix my eyes upon Jesus (Heb. 12:2), the intuitive flow comes from Jesus. But if I fix my gaze upon some desire of my heart, the intuitive flow comes out of that desire. If you are not hearing the Lord's voice, then you are probably not walking with eyes and heart fixed on him! The shepherd's voice is distinct to his sheep. It cannot be duplicated or mimicked. In other words, if another shepherd attempts to signal sheep that do not belong to him, they will not respond well. Similarly, we as Catholic -Christians are the "sheep" that should hear the voice of our shepherd Jesus Christ. Can you hear the voice of Christ? In fact, are you even listening? Many of the problems and trials that we face in our lives could be avoided if we listen to the voice of our shepherd, Jesus. So, what does it mean to "hear the voice of Christ?"

First and foremost, many of the Saints of the Holy Church have heard the actual voice of Christ, in prayer, events, visions and revelations. This might not be something we ever experience in our lives because we are attentive to our computer, news of the day, video games and movies of our superstars! To hear the actual voice of Christ takes some intentional attentiveness. Therefore, it *should not* be an immediate expectation for any Christian. However, each Christian (from my experience) has the ability to hear the voice of Christ in the following ways: 1) a peaceful feeling within the heart of a particular situation or circumstance 2) using our reasonable and intellectual capabilities to make decisions in life 3) seeking an orthodox Priest for counsel and confession 4) realizing that God puts barriers in our life for a reason.

We have all heard of the "gut" feeling. Even though the gut feeling cannot be proven, it is tied to our natural instincts. For a Christian, when we follow the Ten Commandments, pray, and fast on a regular bases, this instills in us an instinctive feeling on what is right and wrong. In other words, our "spiritual antennas" are up and running well. We know when something is not good for our spiritual life. Therefore, the voice of Christ is a sort of non-audible voice that can be felt in our hearts (to be continued...)
