

#### **FASTING AND ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.

# ITURGICAL NOTES

I am risen, and I am always with you, alleluia; you have placed your hand upon me, alleluia; your wisdom has been shown to be most wonderful, alleluia, alleluia." This is the entrance antiphon for Easter Sunday. It really captures the character of the season. Christ is risen, which is our promise of victory over death. He is always with us and will not abandon His Church in her need. The Wisdom of God has worked inconceivable wonders and turned a seemingly hopeless situation into absolute victory. "Alleluia," that happy, happy word, is a cry of joy, a sneer at the devil who thought he had the last word. The offertory tells us that "The earth trembled and was still when God arose in judgement." What is the verdict? Death is *defeated*. It does not have the final say. Then what is left? The communion antiphon calls us to respond in this way: "let us keep the feast by sharing the unleavened bread of uprightness and truth, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia." Christ has defeated sin and death. Welcome Him into your life once more through spiritual communions, acts of love, Rosaries, Divine Mercies, and whatever you can think of! Ask Him to rule your life and cast out that which blocks others from seeing Him in your soul. HE IS RISEN!


